The Bishop's Appeal- Justice For Our Neighbors

Northern Illinois Justice For Our Neighbors (NIJFON) provides free, high quality immigration legal services at its three clinic locations -Aurora, Chicago, and Rockford. This story is from NIFJON Board member Shalley Wakeman:

"I was able to visit the Aurora Clinic and sit in on an intake interview and heard the story of Susana (name changed). In 2012 Susana, then a high school student, sat with her parents and filled out the DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) forms that would allow her to not be deported for two years. She would also be able to work legally in the country for those two years. (She came to this country as an infant). She graduated from high school and enrolled in a local community college. She was studying a two year program to be certified in the medical field. In December 2014, her DACA papers expired. At that time all of her money was going to college costs to complete her certification. She did not have the \$495 for the application fee, or the additional \$500 a lawyer would charge to review her paperwork. She graduated in Dec. 2014, but because her work permit had expired, she was unable to be employed in a higher paying job, the job which she had studied for! She came to the Aurora NIJFON Clinic in early 2015. She was able to obtain free legal services and save on the application fee. This extension will allow her to live and work in the U.S. for another three years. I was happy to see how NIJFON had been able to assist her in reaching her goal of staying in the U.S. (the only country she has known) and making a positive contribution to the community through her work. Susanna was also, happy and thankful to the NIJFON volunteers and staff for their welcoming assistance"

Susana's story is one of many of our young people, and of our neighbors of all ages who are living in fear of deportation because they have been caught in the complexities of our broken immigration system. She is specifically referring to the Executive Action that was announced by President Obama over two years ago.

Once that appeal happens, there will be millions more like Susana who will seek help. Through NIJFON, The United Methodist Church has been able to be with those like Susana through this process. Without that witness, they would be vulnerable to unscrupulous practitioners called

"notarios" (notaries) who pretend to offer legal services without a license to practice law. Your church's contribution to the Bishop's Appeal will allow NIJFON to continue to work with local congregations and many other partners to offer information sessions and legal services for those eligible for executive action.

College Scholarship Fund of Steward United Methodist Church

Introduction to the Fund:

The Scholarship Fund of the Steward United Methodist Church was first established in Spring of 2002 by action of the church's Administrative Board. Its first recipient, for the 2002-2003 academic year was Beth Arne (now Beth Metelko), an undergraduate student attending Anderson University in Indiana. With some modifications in early 2003, the Fund was reaffirmed and continued by vote of the Administrative Board in April 2003.

The purpose of this Scholarship Fund is to tangibly support youth and adults of our church community in their pursuit of education and vocational or professional training beyond high school graduation. It is our prayer that this Fund will continue to grow in available monies through the generosity of our church community, so that a growing number of students may benefit from it. Recipients are encouraged to give back to the Fund, when and as they are able, and as they feel called by God to do so.

The following are the eligibility requirements for consideration for this award:

- 1. Applicant must be a full member of the Steward United Methodist Church.
- 2. Applicant must have officially applied for admission to an accredited degree program at time application is made. If an award is offered, recipient must present proof of acceptance for admission in order to receive awarded monies.
 - Accredited degree program includes the following: undergraduate academic degree program at a community college or a traditional, four-year college; vocational or professional degree programs (ie. Culinary arts degree); and college/university graduate program.
- 3. Application must be completed, with required signature, and submitted (either in person; or if by mail, according to postmark date) by the deadline state below:

For the academic year of 2015-2016, the deadline is July 1, 2015.

Scholarship Fund of the Steward UMC - Procedure for Application

- 1. Obtain information/application form from Pastor, Church Secretary, Committee Member, newsletter, or however.
- 2. Complete application, including signature. Any questions about the application should be addressed to a Scholarship Committee Member or the Pastor. (Scholarship Committee Members are: Pat Arne, Karen Bonnell, Pastor.)
- 3. Submit application by published deadline to a Scholarship Committee Member, Pastor, or by mail to the church (PO Box 80, Steward, IL 60553).
- 4. Scholarship Committee meets no later than one week after the application deadline to review allowing some time for asking any questions which may arise from application information submitted.
- 5. Scholarship Committee makes recommendation of recipients(s) and amount(s) to be awarded to Administrative Council for approval at the next scheduled Council meeting.
- 6. Any changes recommended by Administrative Council are considered by Scholarship Committee at the Council meeting, and final recipient and amount decisions are made thereafter.
- 7. Recipients are immediately notified (by letter) by Scholarship Committee members. Monies to be disbursed after the beginning of the academic year by the church treasurer.
- 8. If a recipient declines a Scholarship Fund award, monies will be carried over in the Fund for the following year's applicants.
- 9. If no one applies to the Fund in a given year, monies will be carried over for the following year's applicants.
- 10. Application procedure and eligibility requirements should be reviewed, revised if necessary, and re-affirmed by Administrative Council every four years.
